OTHER CLUB NEWS

UNS will be 80 years old this year which is an amazing milestone to achieve. There is not another club like this in Minnesota where being a member you can camp for 14 days and have the opportunity for more days with volunteer work hours; have use of a rifle range from 25 yards to 300 yards, a pistol range, and shotgun/trap range and an archery range. Not to mention a boat launch and dockage available for your boat. We have also just been informed from Minnesota Power/Allete that we have permission to use the swimming area just south of the club where there is an enclosed swimming area and an available bathroom. That takes away any worries for parents about children swimming around fishing boats and motors and crowded docks. A true win win situation for all.

As with all things in life the club's costs have gone up significantly, and to help members understand the value of this club I did some investigating. The average cost in the State of Minnesota to camp for a basic campsite is \$30.00 to \$70.00 per night. For a luxurious campsite it is \$80.00 to \$120.00 per night. With that being said, a weekend camping trip could cost anywhere between \$60.00 to \$240.00 for just a campsite, for only 2 nights.

We are also aware that members do not use the club for camping, but only the rifle/pistol ranges. Memberships for those vary greatly also. There is one local club and they charge between \$35.00 to \$70.00 per month for a basic membership and \$60.00 to \$130.00 per month for higher end plus a \$150.00 initiation fee.

It is obvious where this is all going. The club's memberships are no longer covering the costs of maintaining the club. Membership dues have to cover many expenses of the club. These include but are not solely limited to:

Maintenance/repairs/improvements/insurance on buildings, equipment and grounds,

Our (The Clubs) commitment to conservation

Free educational classes we offer for kids and adults.

And yet the fundraisers are still needed to continue with this also. This is a very small, unique club and the membership is what is needed to continue this organization.

As of April 1st 2025 membership dues are going to increase. The new breakdown of fess is as follows.

Single 1 year membership	\$50.00	it was	\$35.00
Single 2-year membership	\$95.00	it was	\$68.00
Family 1 year membership	\$90.00	it was	\$62.00
Family 2-year membership	\$170.00	it was	\$120.00

The increases are truly minimal if it is broken down into a general timeline (From memorial day to Labor day) the club is open for its members it is an astonishing .55 cents a day for a single membership and \$1.00 per day for a one year family membership.

This is still an incredible value for the money you get in what this club offers with your membership. As stated, the rate increase will go into effect on April 1st, 2025. If you choose to renew your membership before that time it will remain at the current prices and those are listed above for your convenience.
